LFPOA POOLS OPEN APRIL 1st

Are you ready for the pools to open!! Please check with the LFPOA Office and make sure your pool card is up to date. If you do not have a magnetic pool PROX card you may make an appointment by calling the LFPOA office at 251-626-0788 to get yours.

Each pool card opens the gates to all 3 of our swimming pools. These pool cards are to be used by LFPOA members only. Remember, no one under the age of 16 is allowed without adult supervision. DO NOT GIVE OUT OR LET A NON-RESIDENT USE THESE CARDS. Below is a Picture of the magnetic pool PROX card.

Swim and Racquet pool will be open for seniors, those needing water therapy for medical reasons and lap swimmers. A special access code will be given to those persons to use the pool between 5:00 AM and Noon.

POOL RULES

Violation of any Rules could lead to suspension or loss of Pool Use Privileges

- Swim at your own risk. No lifeguards on duty
- No alcoholic beverages, glass, or food allowed
- No tobacco products-this includes cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, e cigarettes or vaping
- No running, pushing, dunking, rough play or any type of personal conduct endangering safety of self and others is allowed
- No diving or flips from the side allowed
- No animals, other than certified service animals
- Be courteous to your neighbor. Rude behavior is not allowed
- All swimmers must shower before entering pool
- Do not enter the pool if you have an open cut or sores, or if you are ill with diarrhea, nausea, or nasal or ear discharge, or have any contagious condition
- Pool is available to all Member/Residents in good standing with LFPOA
- Adult Swim Hours are from 8 am to 10 am daily 18 and above only
- At all times, all children under 16 must be under adult supervision
- Swim Diapers are required for all children who are not toilet trained
- Discharge of fecal matter will cause the pool to close immediately
- Tampering with the Access Gate is not authorized and could lead to loss of pool privileges
- Members MUST use active PROX card to enter and have a POA Membership Card
- Sharing of Pool Pass Entry Cards with the general public or with a member that is not in good standing is not allowed and could lead to loss of pool privileges
- Members in good standing can invite up to 4 total guests per day
- Damage to any property or grounds could lead to suspension and loss of pool privileges
- Hours of operation are posted for the season. Anyone entering the pool or pool area outside of the pool hours of operation is trespassing and will be subject to arrest

Inclement Weather Policy

All swimmers must exit pool during thunderstorms.

Pool will reopen 30 minutes after lightning strikes cease.

Pool Events and Parties Policy

- No Pool parties are allowed inside gated areas of Montclair Pool or Ridgewood Pool
- Pool Parties at Swim and Racket Pool are allowed by appointment. Contact the LFPOA office to schedule

POOL CARD INFORMATION

You will need a magnetic pool PROX card to access pools. Get your PROX pool card at the Lake Forest office to fill out the request and pay \$10 service fee. The PROX pool card is good at all 3 pools during open hours. Our Pools are for the enjoyment of our members. Please enjoy and obey our pool rules for your safety and for the safety of your neighbors.

Environmental Restoration of the Lake Forest Lake and D'Olive/Tiawasee Watershed

Dear Homeowners,

The Lake, which Lake Forest gets its name, is important to all the property owners. It is a "Public Resource" with access available to all. Coupled with the amenities that are planned for the Restored Lake, from recreation sites that offer boat ramps, public piers, covered picnic areas, an outdoor environmental learning facility, canoe and kayak launch facilities to a trophy fishery (including a trophy Florida Largemouth Bass fishery), this restoration will allow the entire community to enjoy the Lake. The Lake's documented positive impact on property values throughout the entire subdivision is valuable to all LFPOA members.

The Lake must be restored to the gem quality recreation and aquatic resource it once was. The current process of rapid loss of capacity (already lost 2/3 of its original volume) will continue to progress through the next 70 years. The damaging sediment flows from 77% of this watershed that is outside the Lake Forest Subdivision. These sediment flows have resulted in a Lake depth that is almost unusable (3 ft average) and are currently flowing into the D'Olive Bay and damaging the Marine Estuary System. We are continuing to lose valuable aquatic wildlife, plants, and many other terrestrial species.

Environmental Restoration of the Lake Forest Lake and D'Olive/Tiawasee Watershed







Special Bulk Pick Up and Trash Collection Done by the City of Daphne Public Works...News You Can Use

We are asking our community residents to follow "ALL" guidelines provided by The City of Daphne for Trash Collection and for Bulk Pick Up.

The City of Daphne has an interactive map so you can use to learn when your trash receptacles (plastic bins) and bulk pick-up days are scheduled.

Or you can contact the Public Works Department to inquire about your location at 251-620-2100.

No trash bins or any bulk trash should be placed curbside more than 24-hours ahead of the scheduled pick-up day.

Some Information for Bulk Pick-Up Items:

- No pressure treated wood, will not be collected
- No styrofoam products, will not be collected
- Pine straw must be bagged
- Vegetative debris such as leaves and small branches must be bagged
- No tree limbs over 5 ft in length will be collected
- Tree debris must be no more than 5 inches in diameter
- Household items may be collected (appliances, furniture)
- No more than 15 cubic feet of items will be collected at any one pick-up

Bulk Trash Pick Up Days for Lake Forest:

- Most of the community bulk pick-up days are normally scheduled for Thursday or Friday
- A smaller select area of our community bulk pick up occurs for half a day on Wednesdays
- Do not place bulk items curbside more than 24 hours in advance of pick-up date

Trash Bin Receptacles Collection Days for Lake Forest:

- Most of the Lake Forest trash bin collection occurs on Thursday or Friday.
- A smaller select area of our community trash bin pick-up occurs on Mondays
- More than one bin may be used for each household
- Do not place trash bins curbside more than 24 hours in advance of pick-up date

Large Amount of Bulk Trash - In cases where the amount of items or tree debris exceeds the 15 cubic yard limit the City of Daphne may charge a special fee of \$60 of a half load pick-up and up to \$100 for a full load pick-up. When necessary, Code Enforcement may also be dispatched.

Dumping of any Trash on Vacant Lots – is illegal and Code Enforcement when appropriate may be dispatched.



News from our State House Representative Matt Simpson

It is time to fix the Ethics Laws in Alabama

On Tuesday, April 2, the Alabama House of Representatives will vote on HB227, a bill to address needed reforms to the ethics laws in our state.

I want to set the record straight on this issue and let the public understand what the bill does and why its time to address this issue. According to a report in 2019, there are 300,000 people that directly fall under the ethics laws in our state. By the time you include extended family members, it is estimated that more than 1 million Alabamians can be affected by these laws.



I'm an attorney and I have prosecuted ethics cases in my past - but if our current ethics laws are so poorly written and explained that even I have difficulty understanding them, then what chance do other state employees have in understanding them, people like your children's teachers or your local first responders that keep your community safe?

The major reason I don't understand the laws as they apply currently - the actions and cover of secrecy that the Alabama Ethics Commission is currently operating under confounds and confuses any and all who try to seek its guidance.

The Ethics Commission is required to file an annual report every year, like most businesses or other state agencies. So, on January 24 of this year, they filed their report for the last fiscal year, 2023 ... as well as filing their annual reports for 2022, 2021 and 2020. If any of us tried to turn in required documents at our job almost three years late, we would have already been fired but nothing of consequence has happened to the Ethics Commission for this extreme tardiness.

And this is not the first time they have simply not filed their report on time. It is indicative of a clear pattern of dubious behavior and actions taken under the Commission's current Director. In addition to not filing legally mandated annual reports on time, the Commission has completely changed the way they let people know what is permissible under Alabama law.

In the 7 years under the previous Ethics Director, the Commission averaged 95 informal opinions per year with a high of 147. Informal opinions are private and only the recipient will know how the law is applied in the requested circumstance; formal opinions are published and made public so that other people or groups concerned about similar issues can search through them to see if their ethical question or situation has already been addressed, creating a clear precedent and archive for continued usage.

Under the current Ethics Director, the Commission has averaged 759 informal opinions per year with a high of 982. This exponential increase has caused concern that the Commission isn't letting the public know what they can and can't do. The Commission gave 3 formal opinions in 2023 and only 2 formal opinions in 2022. How can those who fall under the rules of our ethics laws seek actual guidance and clarity if they have no formal opinions to learn from? How can the public trust rulings from an Ethics Commission when the vast majority of their rulings are secret and could easily change on a whim?

There is also a concern that the Ethics Commission is using the threat of criminal charges as leverage for reaching civil administrative resolutions on their cases. If someone is looking down the barrel of a potential 20-year prison sentence, they would absolutely resolve a matter civilly as opposed to facing prosecution. That is not fair to the public. The Ethics Commission should not be permitted to act as judge, jury, and executioner.

HB227 would set clear lines as to how ethics cases are handled in our state. If someone is facing a prison sentence, that case would be handled by the Attorney General's Office or the local District Attorney. A jury of the people of Alabama would be the decider of their fate, just as it is with other criminal cases throughout our state.

For civil violations, the Ethics Commission would handle the fines and/or administrative resolutions that would not be prison sentences, handing out fines not unlike many other state regulatory agencies and boards.

This bill still allows the bad actors to be sent to prison; they would just have to go through prosecutors and not the Ethics Commission, giving those accused of criminal violations the same due process and legal rights that we have come to expect from our American system of justice.

This bill does not weaken the Ethics Laws in our state - far from it. It makes a clear delineation on how they should be interpreted and handled in order to help people know what is or is not ethical behavior.

This bill is written to make sure that the nearly 25 percent of Alabamians who fall under the Ethics laws in our state have a fair chance to know what they can and cannot do.

This bill does not weaken the Ethics Laws in our state - it just makes the public better aware of where the lines are.

If a bad actor crosses the line, that person will be prosecuted and face prison time.

With the reforms I am proposing in this bill, we now will have the ability to let these decisions be open to public scrutiny - something that we have lacked but sorely needed in Alabama for a long time.







Your name will not be posted.


