You will need a magnetic pool card to access pools. To get your magnetic pool card please go to the Lake Forest office to fill out a form and pay just \$5. The magnetic pool card is good at all 3 pools. Please enjoy and obey our pool rules for your safety and your fellow neighbors.

- Pool is available to all Member/Residents in good standing with LFPOA
- Sharing of Pool Pass Entry Cards with the general public or with member not in good standing is not allowed and could lead to loss of pool privileges
- Members in good standing can invite up to 4 total guests per day
- Tampering with the Access Gate is not authorized
- Damage to any property or grounds could lead to suspension from use
- No one under the age of 16 allowed without adult supervision
- All bathers must shower before entering pool
- No alcoholic beverages, glass or food allowed
- No tobacco products-this includes cigarettes, cigars, and chewing tobacco
- No e cigarettes or vaping allowed
- No running, horseplay or rude behavior allowed
- No diving
- Be courteous to your neighbor
- Pets are not allowed in pool area
- Do not enter the pool if you have communicable disease, an open cut or j





News from our State House Representative Matt Simpson

I am thankful to be able to write to you that HB1, the bill I created to mandate prison time for criminals trafficking the deadly drug of fentanyl, has been signed into law by Governor Kay Ivey and is now helping to protect the people of Alabama by making sure that these dealers of death will be serving prison time for their attempts to push this poison of fentanyl into our communities.



I am grateful for Governor Ivey and Speaker Ledbetter making that bill a priority this year and for getting it passed through the legislature and signed so quickly so that it could immediately begin to try to help curb this ongoing fentanyl epidemic.

And I'm not the only Baldwin County House member who has gotten a bill passed here recently. Congratulations are due to freshman Rep. Frances Holk-Jones for getting her first bill through both the House and the Senate this past week, HB56, which helps expand the work that licensed social workers can do for their clients to better help them with the issues they are facing. It was certainly a needed bill and received wide support from both parties and Rep. Holk-Jones should be commended for taking up this bill and getting it over the finish line.

Rep. Jennifer Fidler also recently got legislation passed, albeit in a slightly different way, as she allowed Senator Josh Carnley's SB91 to substitute in for her House companion bill, HB180, in order to get the intended legislation passed more quickly to help a key constituency here in Alabama and one I know is certainly key to Rep. Fidler – our farmers.





News from our State House Representative Contd Matt Simpson

The legislation Rep. Fidler helped sponsor and pass helps streamline some auditing and referendum mandates for our farmers that are required to take place, which allows them to spend less time on bureaucratic nonsense and more time actually farming.

And look for our other freshman Rep. Donna Givens, to be passing some important local legislation soon that will help all of us here in Baldwin County – especially a bill she's worked on with District Attorney Bob Wilters to find a fix in the existing tobacco tax that would allow for a nurse specially trained to deal with sexual abuse victims to be on call 24/7 at our Baldwin County hospitals. This is a vital need in our county and I applaud Rep. Givens for finding a way to provide this needed resource.



Taking care of the yard takes time and creativity to make our gardens look good. This season we would like to put a spotlight on 124 Montclair Loop which is halfway up the hill from Ridgewood.

This house made of cedar was the only one on this road originally when it was built in 1976. Bob Belue had gone into the woods to bring home a wild dogwood for his garden that was one of the first trees that became part of this garden. Now the local dogwoods have been decimated by disease, so Bob has moved on to Loropetulum which are clipped and snipped every few weeks to keep them looking neat and just so. Also, a maple tree adds contrast.

Bob and Betty Belue often sit on their porch, which looks very cozy as they look out on their neighborhood. Colorful geraniums are sitting on the porch steps that have come from the country store " Country Wagon on 31 in Spanish Fort. Another feast for the senses is the backyard, an Orange tree was there for many a year but now it is replaced by an English dogwood, hibiscus and hydrangeas. The Belue's prepared for the cold freeze we had earlier this year by covering their cold-sensitive plants (with their car covers) like their bougainvilleas and bromeliads and managed to save quite a few. They have raised 6 dachshunds over the years who have enjoyed the backyard as well as the plants. Mr. Belue is kind to his potted plants changing out the soil almost yearly with miracle grow potting mix, as well as attending to the watering needs.

Maybe they will be on their porch when you stop by to enjoy their landscaping work to put a smile on your face.


