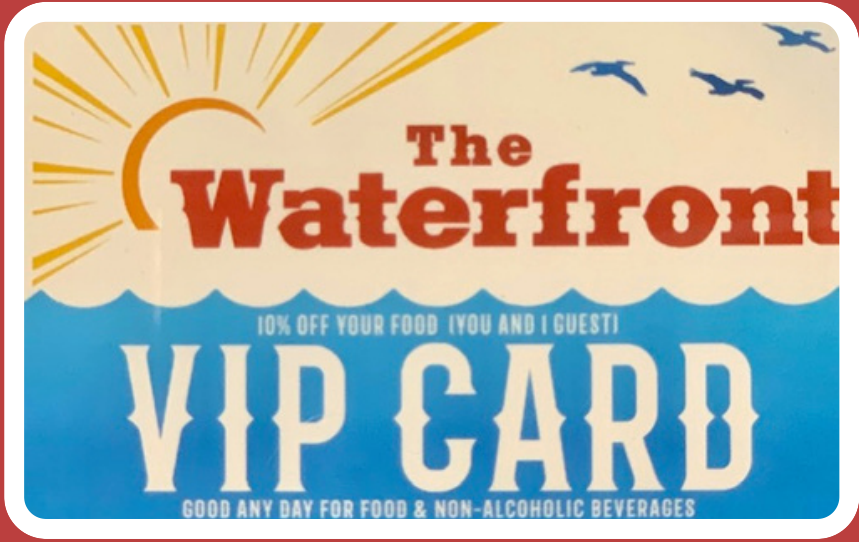

News from our State House Representative Matt Simpson

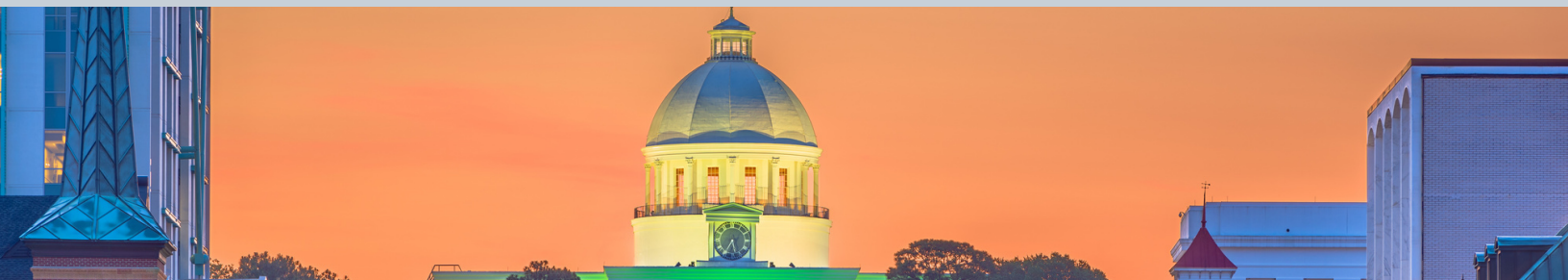


In recent years, the Alabama Legislature has been making significant strides in addressing the pressing issue of mental health. Because of the growing mental health crisis our state’s citizens continue to face, we have seen the Legislature take bold, swift action in that arena, making sure that we are providing the best resources and programs available to try to help people get back on the road to wellness.

And these actions have seen tremendous bipartisan support. This is not a Republican or Democrat issue, this is not a liberal or conservative issue – this has been a crisis that touches almost every single family in our state in some way or fashion and it is our state government’s obligation to do our part to fix it as best we can.

One of the most notable achievements in recent years that has been a critical development in Alabama’s mental health landscape is the introduction of mobile crisis centers across the state. These centers, strategically placed in different regions of the state, provide timely intervention and support during mental health crises. Trained professionals can quickly respond to individuals experiencing severe mental health challenges, offering immediate assistance and connection to appropriate services to help with ongoing treatment.

Those mobile crisis centers have already been a godsend across Alabama in helping to prevent crises from escalating and helping our people get the care that they need in the region in which they live. Because of the push from my fellow legislators and I here in southwest Alabama in our Mobile and Baldwin County delegations, I am proud to say that we have one of those crisis centers here in Mobile that has made a good impact and will continue to help our local residents experiencing mental health crises.





I remain proud of the establishment of the Baldwin County Mental Health Court, a testament to our county's commitment to addressing mental health issues with awareness and treatment. This specialized court is designed to divert individuals with mental health issues away from the traditional criminal justice system and into treatment programs that address their needs.

By focusing on rehabilitation and treatment for the underlying mental health issues, this court not only aims to improve the lives of individuals but also reduce the burden on the criminal justice system. And it has made and will continue to make a difference in the lives of Baldwin County citizens in need.

Furthermore, Alabama is taking a significant step forward in improving access to mental health services by supporting the implementation of the 9-8-8 service for mental health emergencies, an effort that is being championed by my fellow House member and Baldwin Delegation member Rep. Frances Holk-Jones.

This initiative will establish a dedicated three-digit number, similar to 911, that individuals can call when they are in the midst of a mental health crisis. The goal is to streamline access to immediate assistance and connect individuals with specially trained crisis intervention professionals who can provide them with the exact type of help that they need.

The 9-8-8 program is an important facet in Alabama's commitment to understanding the urgency surrounding mental health emergencies and the need for a more efficient response system. With her expertise in the field of mental health, I know that Rep. Holk-Jones will continue to be a leader on this issue, and I am glad we have her voice as a champion for the people across our state.

These legislative efforts are just a few examples that indicate a growing recognition within Alabama's government that mental health is vital and that we must address issues with mental health before they develop into greater societal problems. By investing in diversion programs like the Baldwin County Mental Health Court, creating mobile crisis centers, and endorsing the 9-8-8 service, the state is moving in the right direction towards improving the mental health infrastructure and our citizens' overall mental health.

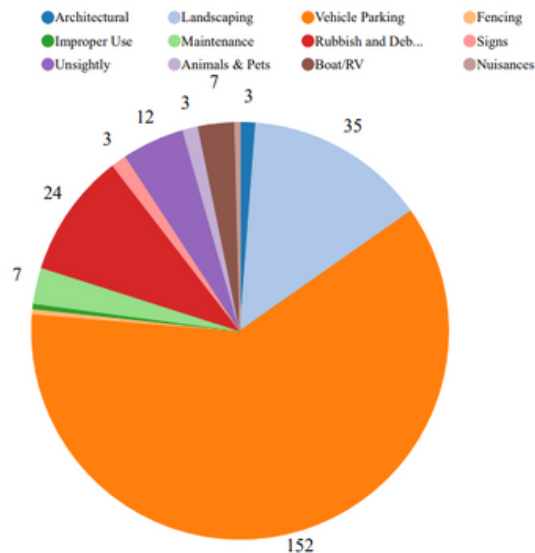

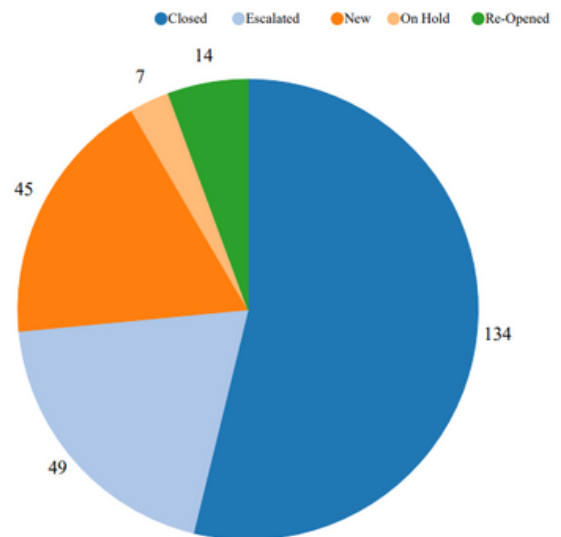

Special Bulk Pick Up and Trash Collection Done by the City of Daphne Public Works...News You Can Use

We are asking our community residents to follow “ALL” guidelines provided by The City of Daphne for Trash Collection and for Bulk Pick Up.

The City of Daphne has an interactive map so you can use to learn when your trash receptacles (plastic bins) and bulk pick-up days are scheduled.

Or you can contact the Public Works Department to inquire about your location at 251-620-2100.

No trash bins or any bulk trash should be placed curbside more than 24-hours ahead of the scheduled pick-up day.

Some Information for Bulk Pick-Up Items:

- No pressure treated wood, will not be collected
- No styrofoam products, will not be collected
- Pine straw must be bagged
- Vegetative debris such as leaves and small branches must be bagged
- No tree limbs over 5 ft in length will be collected
- Tree debris must be no more than 5 inches in diameter
- Household items may be collected (appliances, furniture)
- No more than 15 cubic feet of items will be collected at any one pick-up

Bulk Trash Pick Up Days for Lake Forest:

- Most of the community bulk pick-up days are normally scheduled for Thursday or Friday
- A smaller select area of our community bulk pick up occurs for half a day on Wednesdays
- Do not place bulk items curbside more than 24 hours in advance of pick-up date

Trash Bin Receptacles Collection Days for Lake Forest:

- Most of the Lake Forest trash bin collection occurs on Thursday or Friday.
- A smaller select area of our community trash bin pick-up occurs on Mondays
- More than one bin may be used for each household
- Do not place trash bins curbside more than 24 hours in advance of pick-up date

Large Amount of Bulk Trash - In cases where the amount of items or tree debris exceeds the 15 cubic yard limit the City of Daphne may charge a special fee of \$60 of a half load pick-up and up to \$100 for a full load pick-up. When necessary, Code Enforcement may also be dispatched.

Dumping of any Trash on Vacant Lots – is illegal and Code Enforcement when appropriate may be dispatched.

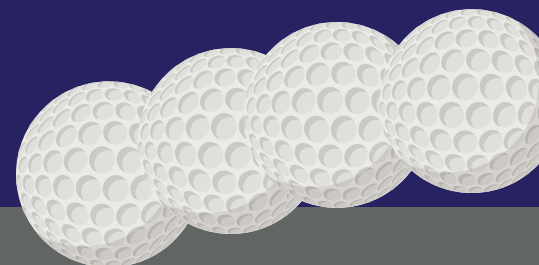

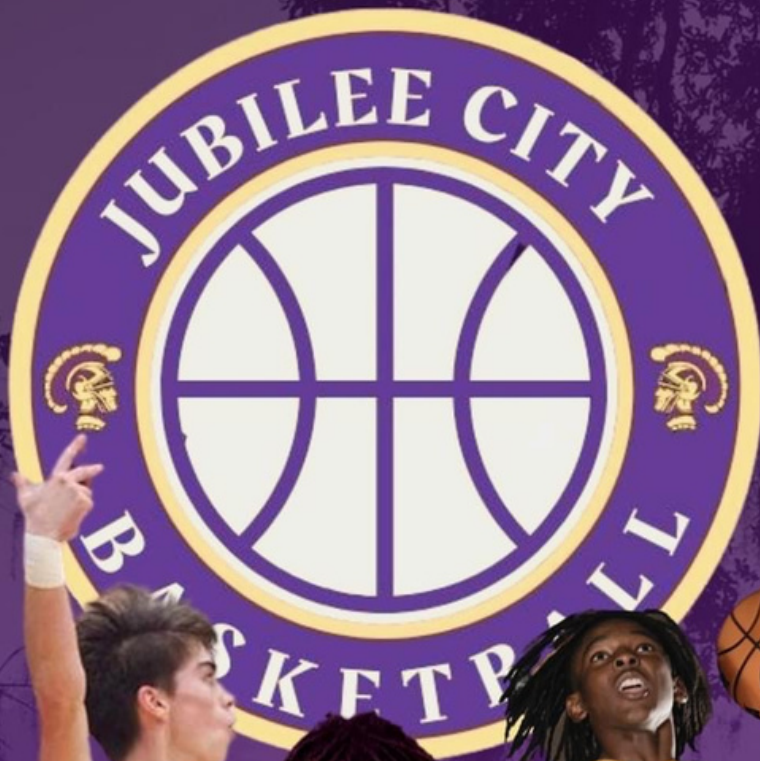

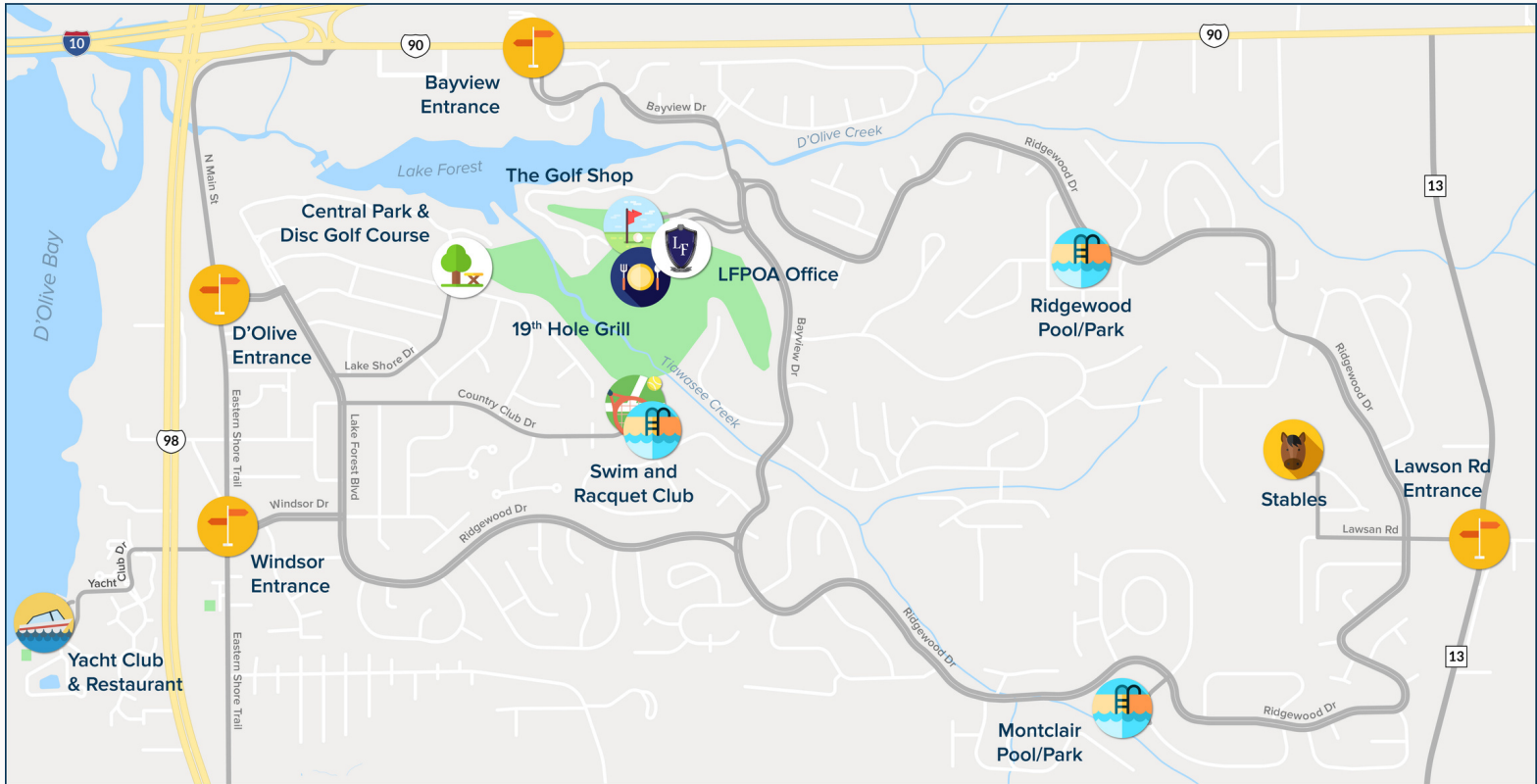
