Policy Guidelines for LFPOA Special Events

These Policy Guidelines apply to the following official LFPOA Special Events:

- Easter Egg Hunt
- St Patrick's Day
- 4th of July
- Fall Festival/Trunk or Treat
- Festival of Lights
- Breakfast with Santa
- Neighborhood Garage Sale (with Arts and Crafts booths)

Statement of Purpose:

Our Special Events are meant to be celebrations of the season for the enjoyment of LFPOA Members, their children, families, and guests. They are not intended to become tools for any charity, special interest group private group, religious, or political group to use as a recruiting or money-making opportunity. LFPOA resources are for the benefit its Members.

Special Event Policy Guidelines:

- All LFPOA Members in good standing, their children, families, and guests of members are invited to participate
- No tents for politicians or political causes at any level allowed
- No displays or signs for political, special interest, religious or similar causes allowed
- No collection of money for clubs, charities, or any third-party unless specifically approved. In times of national, state, or local emergencies, LFPOA may make an exception for events to solicit donations for a specific charitable cause
- Food trucks - variety, price and support for Lake Forest should be a priority. Food trucks must have appropriate licensing and required permits.
- The Neighborhood Garage Sale event allows booths for selling arts and crafts. Any sales at other events are subject to approval.
- No one will be charged to participate in Neighborhood Garage Sale initiatives or other similar Lake Forest activities meant to help the residents who participate
- The Board will appoint an ad hoc Committee to manage each official Festival event.
- House and Ground Rules will be honored at all events

Management Responsibilities:

- Ensure the event is adequately staffed with personnel on site to ensure these Guidelines are followed, as well as the House and Ground Rules
- Determine whether to open the 19th Hole and what will be served, considering the impact of food trucks (if applicable) on their profit margin.
- Arrange for the collection and removal of garbage.
- Stage set up (if applicable)
- Lighting set up and storage
- Sound system set up and storage
- Electrical power and extension cords set up where required and storage
- Decorations and figurine set up and storage
- Select and coordinate Santa and Easter costume volunteers
- Publicize the event, including flyers
- Develop an event map to include signs directing traffic to park and set up area
- Schedule and coordinate workdays with the Committee
- Collect receipts from the Committee and account for LFPOA funds

Committee Responsibilities:

- Develop event outline and parameters
- Be familiar and follow these policies and all LFPOA House and Ground Rules which will be honored at all events
- Select food truck participants (if applicable)
- Staging: develop plan for booths, trunk-treat layout, food trucks, etc.
- Ensure booths and trucks are set up on time
- Spend only budgeted funds for the event and turn in all receipts to Management.
- Police festival to make sure all Guidelines are followed
- Ensure trash is collected and removed from the festival area during the event
- Ensure the area is left as it was found prior to the Festival
- Ensure participants set up (a minimum of) one to two hours prior to the start of the event
- Scheduling and coordinating workdays with Management is essential

Digital News Letter Publication Guidelines presented by Communications and Events Committee:

Publications by groups other than LFPOA recognized organizations to recruit or promote will be limited. Scout organizations and other well established youth organizations that promote citizenship and community involvement will be allowed. All articles are subject to approval and content editing.

The following topics will be included in every digital publication if available.

- Highlight a resident or someone using an amenity (possible front page)
- Letter from the board
- Pubic announcements when needed
- Advertise tournaments Golf, Back Deck, Tennis, 19th Hole, stables, holiday events, specials and news
- City Liaison report when needed
- Club news such as mission statements, dates times and places of next meetings and/or events
- Publish twice per year the schedule and price of all camps
- Real Estate sales, houses sold, avg. price, etc.
- Money collected from delinquent dues accounts (with a short statement of how to resolve delinquent accounts and what residents face if not resolved. It could be one or two sentences)

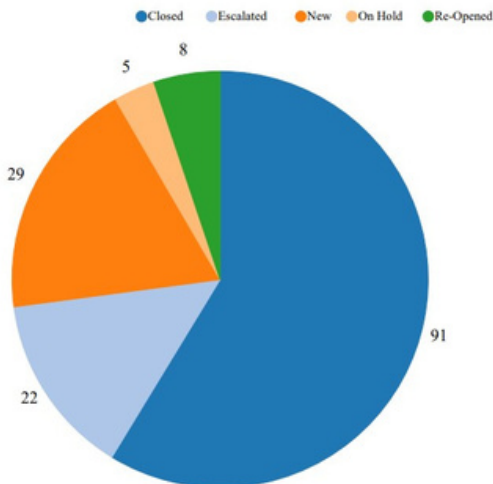

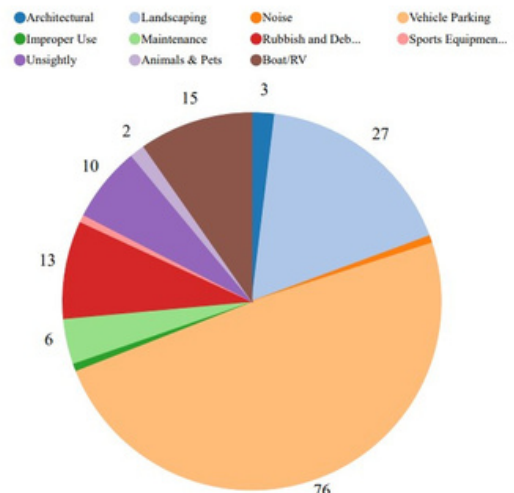

City Liaison Update

Lawson Road from Ridgewood Drive to County Rd 13 resurface completed

- Lake Forest Road Resurfacing Project for 2022 nearly completed
- Marina Boat Ramp Area Phase II Grant Project Underway for Park Parking Area Improvements and additions of kayak launch; scheduled to complete by Jan 2023
- Phase VII Decorative Sign Program completed by Daphne Public Works Dept which completes our thoroughfares Ridgewood Drive, Bayview Drive, and Lake Forest Blvd
- Halloween "Trunk or Treat" sponsored by the POA is planned for 29 October 2022 from 4 pm to 6 pm at the marina; (rain date is 30 October 2022); this event is open for all local residents
- City has approved a resolution on 19 Sep 2022 that would allow for the sale of "medical marijuana" from a State of Alabama approved licensed dispensary. The resolution passed by Daphne is similar to others that have also been passed recently by other local cities such as Loxley and Foley. Any location for Daphne will still need to complete an application with the Daphne Planning Commission.
- City is currently in the planning stages to add sidewalks city-wide that will include the remaining segments necessary to complete Ridgewood Drive and Bayview Drive by 2026

News from our State House Representative Matt Simpson



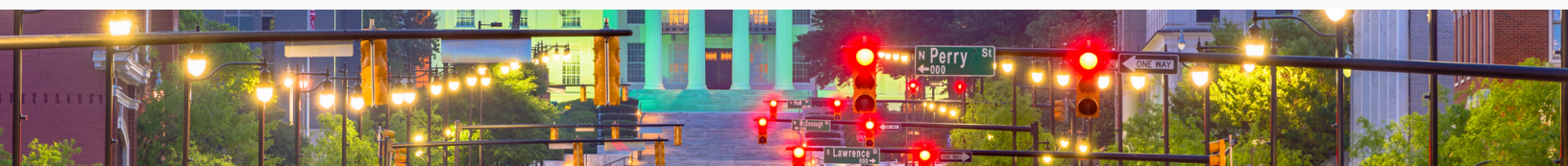
A few weeks ago, I had the honor of getting to stand with Baldwin County Sheriff Hoss Mack and other Baldwin and Mobile County law enforcement officials to announce that I would be filing a bill in our next legislative session that would make sure that people who are trafficking the drug fentanyl in the state of Alabama will get the jail time they deserve.

I am sure many of you have heard about fentanyl in the news these last few years – it’s a powerful opioid medication that is comparable to morphine and oxycodone but about 50 to 100 times more powerful than both of those drugs and much more addictive and deadly.

While fentanyl’s original uses were for battlefield medicine for our soldiers and pain relief for cancer patients, it has quickly become a highly addictive street drug that is destroying our communities and killing our loved ones.

According to the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), an overdose amount of fentanyl can be as small as 2 milligrams. To put that in perspective, a packet of coffee sweetener is about 1,000 milligrams, so just one packet full of fentanyl could actually kill about 500 people, which is terrifying and we have to do something to get this drug epidemic under control.

This deadly drug is being found in a variety of other substances – heroin, cocaine, marijuana – and being passed off as other items like prescription pills and even breath mints, seemingly harmless items that can and have killed people across our area, state and nation.

Fentanyl also puts our law enforcement officers and first responders at risk from inadvertent touch or accidental inhalation of fentanyl while undergoing their duties, which happened to one of our Baldwin County Sheriff's deputies earlier this year.

Just last year, over 60 people in Baldwin County were killed by this drug, but, unlike every other drug, fentanyl does not require a mandatory prison sentence when someone is found guilty of trafficking. This creates a situation where one of these dealers of death who pushes this poison into our neighborhoods could simply be hit with a fine, pay for it with their stacks of drug money and be back out on our streets and endangering lives. That is not acceptable to me, and I know it isn't for all of you either.

My bill will create mandatory jail sentences for people found guilty of trafficking, which will treat this deadly drug like every other deadly drug that is being illegally sold to people – just like heroin, just like cocaine, just like methamphetamine.

The weight requirements attached to how much of this drug they are trafficking will determine the jail time they get, but the amounts are enough to where an average user would not be hit with a trafficking charge for possessing a substance that contained fentanyl they may not have known was there.

Alabama families have already been hit too hard by this drug and it is past time to do something to stem this terrible and tragic tide. This is one step we must take to help protect our loved ones and our friends, and I sincerely hope you will join me in supporting this legislation.

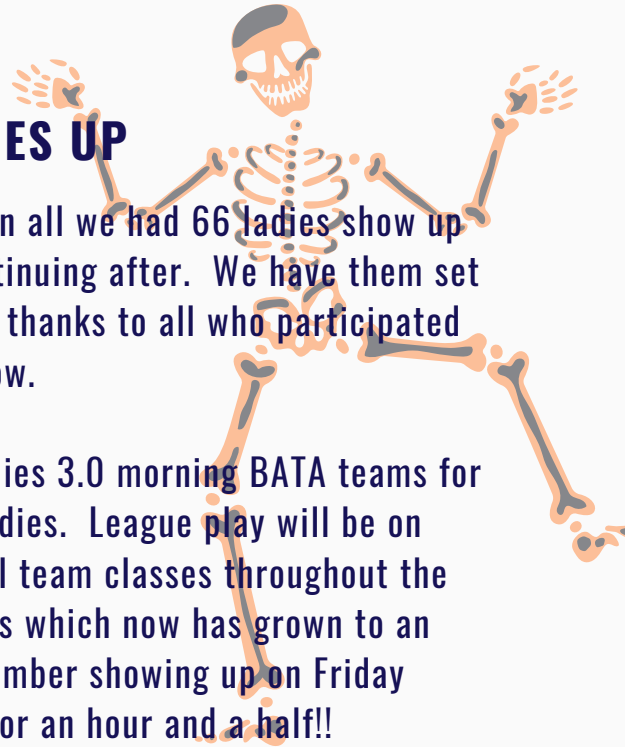
Racquet Club News

Halloween Safety Tips

October is Halloween month!! This highly anticipated holiday is always exciting and fun-filled for most people. Children get to put on their favorite costumes and move from one house to another, while adults get to host or attend Halloween parties. To make this time trick-free and ensure that everyone stays safe, parents, neighbors, and drivers should take additional caution. Read on to learn some Halloween safety tips for children and adults.

Dress Appropriately

It is crucial to consider safety when choosing the coolest or scariest costume for this holiday. For instance, children and adults should wear light-colored clothes to make it easier for drivers to see them when near traffic.

Alternatively, consider decorating your costumes with reflective tape and stickers. Children should also carry flashlights or wear bracelets and necklaces that glow in the dark to remain visible. These accessories will also enable you to identify the kids among other kids at night.

Also, your kids' clothes should be the right size and have a hem several inches off the ground. This will help to ensure that they do not trip and fall or get caught on twigs as they run around.

Attend Community Events

Business associations, community groups, police districts, and other groups often host Halloween events for local communities. Some shopping malls and schools also set up parties in pumpkin patches.

These community parties are well-organized and safer for kids than the door-to-door trick-or-treating. If there are no community events taking place nearby, you can collaborate with your friends or family and organize one.

Walk Safely

When crossing the road, use crosswalks and follow traffic signals. It is also safe to cross streets at the corners and to walk on sidewalks. Adults should avoid using electronics while crossing streets or driving so that they can concentrate on the road.





Halloween Safety Tips contd.

Drive Safely

Statistics indicate that kids are more likely to get hit and killed by a vehicle during Halloween than on any other day. For this reason, adults should drive slowly or at the indicated speed limit, especially in residential areas.

You should also be alert because children are usually excited during this holiday and may jump on the road unpredictably. Additionally, turn your headlights on, even if it is not dark outside. If you have already organized a party and alcohol is part of the celebration, ensure that you designate a sober driver for the trip.

Establish a Curfew

If your child is going trick-or-treating unsupervised, establish a curfew to prevent them from staying out all night. Also, ensure that they carry a cell phone and advise them to call you if they use an unfamiliar street or route. Make them memorize your home address before leaving.

Inspect Snacks Before Eating



Hurricane Preparedness

WHAT TO DO BEFORE A STORM

Prepare a plan for evacuation.

Have a supply kit that could include:

- Wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Water, one gallon per person per day, for at least three days
- Food, non-perishable; at least a three-day supply
- Manual can opener
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio and a NOAA Weather Radio with tone alert (extra batteries)
- Flashlight (extra batteries)
- First-aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air
- Plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Local maps (or updated GPS) showing evacuation routes
- Cell phone with chargers, inverter or solar charger
- Pet supplies (if applicable)
- Week's supply of medication
- Identification for every person
- Emergency contact information
- Insurance information
- Health care information

Create a list of key agencies you may need to monitor or contact. If possible, use the phone apps when available, as you may not have access to a computer.

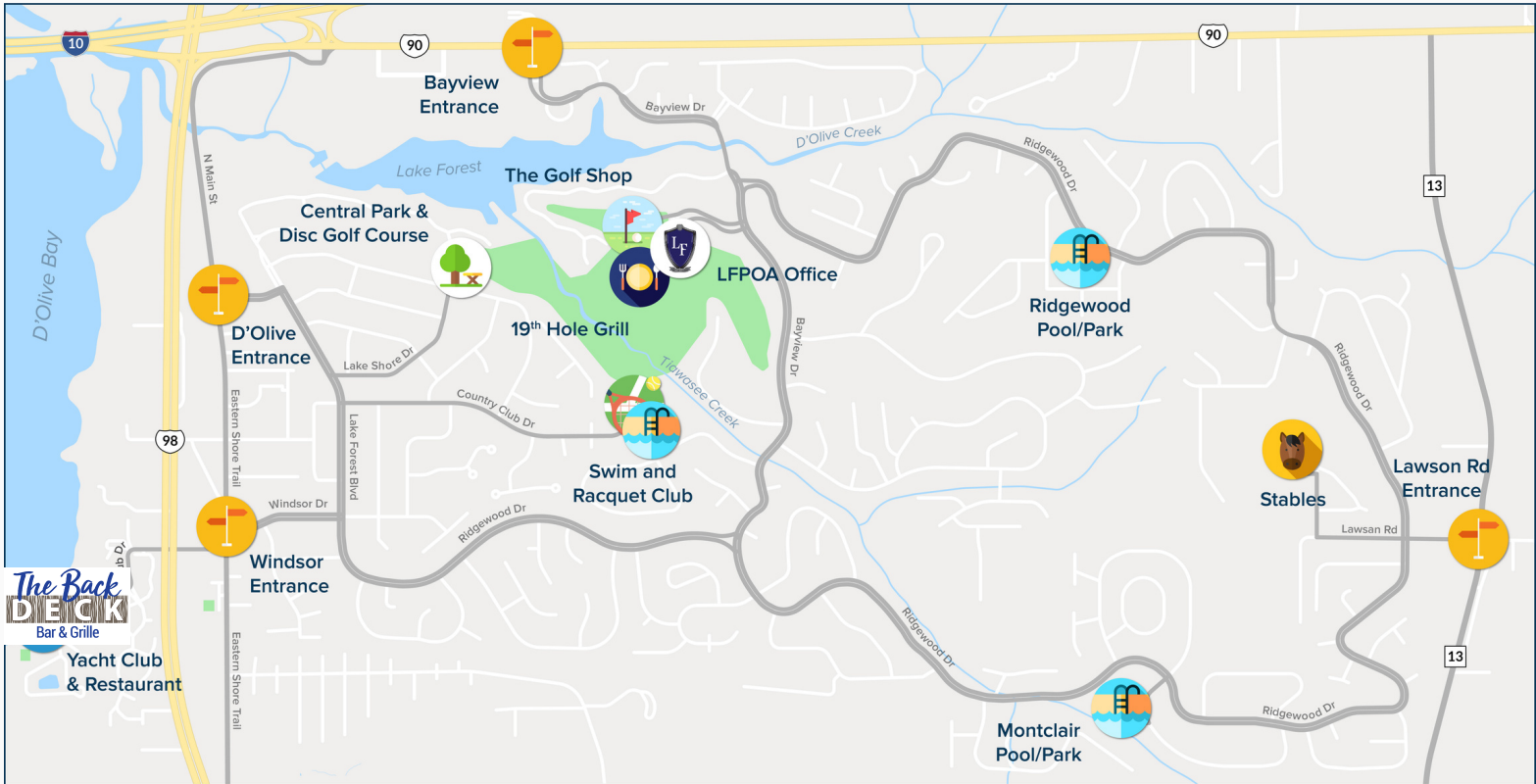
